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IAESTE International

Imagine the time after 1945: World war II had left lots of grief and destruction. Large parts of the world were torn into pieces, but people hoped to build a better, more peaceful world. In 1948, IAESTE was established to give students the chance to gain technical experience abroad and to promote international understanding and goodwill. Nowadays, IAESTE has over 80 member countries. Accomodation

IAESTE will help you find accommodation and assist you with any other questions you might have. They will offer the chance to stay with a host family but feel free to look for other options if you need to.

Insurance

Students must have an International Health Insurance to come, we recommend all the students to know how it is working properly in Ecuador, and what is the process in case of any accidents or diseases. The insurance policy must be written in english. Consider the following:

- Emergency medical evacuation up to \$250,000
- Repatriation up to \$50,000, Accidental death and dismemberment up to \$15,000
- Emergency reunion up to \$12,500, mental health care, coverage of preexisting conditions)





It is necessary to bring with you cash for at least the first month of the program. At the end of the month, you will get the payment by the employer, and, in most cases, that will only cover your room and transportation.

Ecuador uses US Dollars as the official currency.

- 1 EUR = 1,08 USD
- 1 PLN = 0,25 USD



Electricity

The electrical current in Ecuador is 120V, 60Hz. Ecuador sockets are mostly as shown in the picture below. Do remember to bring an adaptor for your devices if needed.

Upon arrival

Public Transportation

Public transportation in Quito reaches the majority of places within the city. Each bus ride costs approximately \$0,35 although depending the destination this could go up to \$1.

Consider that Quito now has a recently opened subway line that crosses the city from North to South, each metro ride is \$0,45.



Minimum taxi fares are \$1,50 and from the airport to the city is around \$30 during daily hours.

Interprovincial transportation

There are different operators that offer interprovincial transportation operators within the city. Depending on your destination, touristic sites are often reached as official stops of the operators, but be prepared to use both bus and taxis to reach your final destination.

The final cost of the bus ticket will depend on where you travel but prices can vary from USD 10 to USD 22




Local SIM Card

Getting a prepaid plan is the best option for your stay. Most providers offer several prepaid plan options that can fit your needs whether you use your phone a lot (calls and data) or casually.

We will give you a welcome kit with a Tuenti sim card that you can use. To activate it you must follow the steps below:

- 1. You will need: Your passport, your chip ICC number (you can find the number on the back of your chip, it strats with the numbers 8959...) and the phone number from your Tuenti chip.
- 2. Download the Tuenti app in your phone. In the bottom right part you will find the button "Ayuda". Click on it and it will land on list of options

3. Scroll down and you will find the button "Chatear". Click on it and you will be taken to a chat where a Tuenti employee will help you activate your account.



In Ecuador Security

We recommend you take care of yourself, since being alone in Ecuador can be tricky as a foreigner. Here are some tips that you should follow to keep you safe:

- Avoid walking alone at night
- Do not bring with you more than 20 dollars cash at once
- When you are walking or taking public transportation, keep your laptop or cell phone in a safe place to avoid the attention of thiefs
- You will need a copy of your passport instead of the original, only take your original passport when you are travelling.

Gastronomy: Fruits

Passion Fruit

Soursop

Cultural Events

First Declaration of Independence

The First major attempt for independence started nearly 300 years of Spanish colonization. The citizens of Quito (Ecuador's capital) were the first to rebel and declare independence on August 10th, 1809. To commemorate the date the capital celebrates a series of events within the old town and the city.



Guayaquil Independence Day

The independence of Guayaquil is celebrated every October 9th in Ecuador. Vibrant cultural performances, such as traditional music, dance, and theatrical reenactments, are held throughout the city to celebrate Ecuador's rich heritage and diversity...



Dia de los Difuntos

The Day of the Dead, known as "Día de los Difuntos" in Ecuador, is a significant tradition celebrated on November 2nd each year. This day is a time to honor and remember deceased loved ones by visiting cemeteries, bringing flowers, and sharing traditional food with the departed. It is traditional to eat "Guaguas de pan" with "colada morada" during this day.



Cuenca's Independence Day

The Independence of Cuenca is celebrated on November 3rd in Ecuador. On this date, the city of Cuenca, located in the southern part of Ecuador, gained its independence from Spanish colonial rule in 1820. The festivities include colorful parades, dances, parties, fireworks displays, as well as food fairs and sports events. Cuenca, declared a UNESCO World Cultural Heritage site, invites you to enjoy the vibrant festive atmosphere of the city.



Quito Independence Day

Every 6th of December, Quito commemorates its independence from the Spanish colonies. The local government organizes around 200 events annually within the city. It is typical of this date to drink the special bevrage called "Canelazo" whille playing the ecuadorian card game "Cuarenta".
